Community Capacity Building Updates

It is hard to believe it is already May! We hope everyone is enjoying the beginning of spring and warmer weather! It has been a busy few months for our community association.

In January, we received the first Waterloo Region Capacity Building Fund payment under the upstream initiative. We also held board planning sessions and community consultation listening circles to hear from community members about the needs and priorities for the next two years.

March 4, 2023, we celebrated the 127 Adwa Victory commemoration at Stanley Park Community Centre with a free dinner and enjoyed a historical theatre.

Between January and April, the association held indoor soccer and basketball drop-in/practices for children at the Family Centre Community Hub. We had over eighty children participate in the ten-week program.

During March break, we organized a science camp in partnership with the University of Waterloo Engineering outreach team (ESQ) and over thirty children from the community participated. As a result of the success of this partnership, the ESQ team has offered a one-week STEM Camp for our community in the summer for free. Several parents have registered their children, and registration is now full, with a waiting list available.

In April, using the capacity building fund we received from the region of Waterloo, we advertised a new events coordinator/administrative assistant position and filled the position successfully. We thank all the applicants and are overjoyed to see the interest in serving our community.

On May 8, 2023, Sara attended a community roundtable discussion with educators from the Waterloo Region District School Board (WRDSB), community, and parent groups. The discussion emphasized the importance of prioritizing the well-being and experiences of children in the community. Suggestions from the community included the importance of active listening and following up with appropriate action, bridging the communication gap and the need to exchange contact information.

Sara has started receiving calls and supporting the community as needed.

We continue to participate in various regional meetings and discussions, representing our community, communicating its needs and challenges, and looking for opportunities to partner with other organizations and share knowledge and information to strengthen communities.

School Tips for Parents

Parent involvement is essential for a child's well-being and academic success. Parents can participate in their child's learning by getting involved in their child's school work, speaking with children about their school and listening to children and encouraging them. In addition, parents can communicate with teachers or volunteer at their child's school by joining a school council or by talking to the school staff about available opportunities for parents to get involved.
